Funding for Australian Mining and Primary Steel (MPS) Australian business secured through Credit Suisse Asset Management (CSAM), who originally funded through Greensil. Wind up application withdrawn when deal was secured. Funding for the greater business ongoing Major Fraud office investigation in UK – no update Coal price – rose to historical high above \$400/t, has reduced recently to around \$315/t for Hard Coking Coal (HCC) (Tahmoor 89% of HCC). Iron ore prices have fallen, mainly driven by oversupply as steel making in China has slowed. <p>8.2.
